

City Chase
2008 World Championships
Official Rules

1. Eligibility:

In order to compete in The City Chase 2008 World Championships (the "Competition"), participants must have qualified through a qualifying regional City Chase competition in the 2008 season (the "Qualifier"). Participants must compete in the Competition in the same two-member team that qualified in the Qualifier, unless otherwise allowed by City Chase Inc. at their sole discretion. At least one member of the team must be a legal citizen of the country in which they won the qualifying City Chase event, as documented by a current passport or similar government-issued documentation. The winning team of the Competition must have no restrictions on their ability to travel to Marrakech, Morocco and to participate in the City Chase World Championships event scheduled to be held from November 4th to November 9th, 2008. Prior to participating in the Competition, participants must sign and return a Participation, Liability and Publicity Release and Waiver to City Chase Inc. by the deadline specified in the documentation or you may be disqualified.

If any participant is unable to travel to Morocco, unable to provide all required documentation, unable to attend on the dates specified, or fails to attend the Competition for any reason, the participant and his/her teammate will be disqualified and forfeit the right to travel to or to participate in the Competition.

If any member of the winning team is unable to travel to Marrakech, Morocco, unable to provide all required documentation, unable to attend on the dates specified, or fails to attend The City Chase World Championships for any reason, the participant and his/her teammate will be disqualified and forfeit the right to travel to or to participate in The City Chase World Championships.

If any participant is unable to travel to the Competition on the itinerary arranged by City Chase Inc., participant will be solely responsible for travel to and from the Competition.

Any participant deemed to have prior knowledge concerning the Competition will be disqualified. This includes, but is not limited to, employees of City Chase Inc., members of any partnership organization directly involved in the Competition, or any of their immediate family members (defined as spouses, parents, siblings or children, regardless of where they reside) or members of their household (whether or not related).

2. The Competition:

The Competition consists of a series of challenges (each a "challenge") which teams must successfully complete. Teams may be eliminated at any time through the Competition for failure to complete a challenge, or otherwise based on the format of the challenge. After the application of any time credits and/or penalties, the first team to have both teammates reach the identified finish area from the intended direction will be declared the winner, subject to completion of the required challenges, compliance with these Official Rules, and verification by the Competition Officials.

In the unlikely event of a tie, the scores (time/score, depending on the structure of the challenge) of the tied teams will be compared for the last challenge completed (and so on, until the tie can be broken), and the team with the best score will be declared the winner. In the unlikely event that the teams tied in all prior challenges, Competition Officials reserve the right to assign a final, tie-breaking challenge to the tied teams and the winner of that challenge will be declared the winner of the Competition.

During the Competition participants **must**:

- Obey all local laws, regulations, bylaws and rules of the road. Participants are solely responsible for their actions and the consequences of those actions. Time penalties may be imposed by the Competition Officials should a team violate any law (including but not limited to speed limits)

during the Competition. Note: If a team is delayed due to the daily course of traffic, construction, mechanical or technical failure, police interference or inability to navigate the roads, it will not be credited time or receive compensation of any kind for said delays.

- Specific rules while driving the vehicle provided include but are not limited to:
 - a. Obey posted speed limits at all times.
 - b. Absolutely no drinking and driving - Zero tolerance
 - c. Make a full stop at all marked intersections.
 - d. Properly using signal lights to let other drivers know your intent.
 - e. Slow down and using caution around schools, hospitals, playgrounds, and other community zones.
 - f. Dim vehicle lights when approaching other cars at night.
 - g. Respect other motorists' and pedestrians' right of way.
 - h. Avoiding passing on solid yellow lines, curves, hills, or where there are blind spots on the road.
 - i. Absolutely no travel on gravel roads unless specific instructed otherwise.

Time penalties will be imposed by the Competition Officials should a team violate any of the above guidelines during the Competition.

- Stay within fifty (50) feet of their teammate at all times, unless explicitly instructed otherwise by a Competition Official.
- Wear the official Competition shirt (the "Shirt") as instructed, and carry any equipment (including, without limitation, backpacks, cell phones or other items issued by Competition Officials) when and as instructed by Competition Officials.
- Shirt must be worn at all times (unless otherwise instructed by Competition Officials), in such a way that it, and any printing on it, is visible at all times (i.e. any additional clothing must be worn under the Shirt; Shirt may not be worn as a bandana, belt, or other than as a shirt).
- Carry identification, a photocopy of your passport or Citizenship Card. and the Competition Official emergency phone number on your person at all times.
- Comply with the directions of the Competition Officials, local authorities, and property and/or venue owners and managers.

Participants **may**:

- Use the general public (with whom there is absolutely no prior connection whatsoever) as a resource during the Competition, provided that such assistance otherwise complies with these Official Rules. The person (or persons) may not be used for an extended amount of time i.e. A participant/team may not ask a stranger to race "with" them.
- Use any technology that may be provided by the Competition Officials, including but not necessarily limited to a cellular telephone or other communication devices, at various points during the Competition. Participants are responsible for these items at all times. If lost or damaged, participants must report this to a Competition Official immediately. Any such items must remain with the participants at all times (when provided unless explicitly told otherwise by Competition Officials). Participants are responsible for ensuring that they remain charged (extra batteries and/or chargers will be provided) and in good working condition.
- Carry certain personal items, only if approved by the Competition Officials prior to the start of the Challenge, which may include but is not necessarily limited to glasses, prescription medication, sunglasses, watches (if not GPS-enabled), sunscreen, and water.

Participants **may not**:

- Carry or use any GPS-enabled device, credit cards or other devices or items not specifically allowed according to these Official Rules or otherwise permitted by a Competition Official. Teams will be subjected to a full search prior to each Competition day, and may be immediately disqualified if they attempt to carry items that are not otherwise permitted or arranged for items on the Competition route for future use.
- Carry any money unless it was given by the Competition Officials or otherwise obtained in accordance with the terms of an applicable challenge or otherwise communicated by Competition Officials.
- Solicit (beg for) any items including money, clothing, equipment, food, etc,
- Pre-arrange or accept, help, assistance, support, guidance and/or contributions of any kind from, or communicate with, any family member, friend or acquaintance other than their teammate, whether directly or indirectly. It is the obligation of the participants to decline any such assistance if offered.
- Wear any clothes or items, or carry clothes/items, that explicitly communicate and/or display any logos, wording, and artwork, not previously approved by Competition Officials. Competition Officials have the right to disallow participants from wearing/carrying clothing/items at their sole discretion.
- Use of any private mode of transportation, other than what is provided by the Competition Officials. Teams may not travel in a private vehicle (i.e. accept rides from others), use bicycles, in-line skates, or any other mode of transport. Travel is only permitted by foot, or public transit, unless specifically authorized otherwise by a Competition Official.
- Engage in unsportsmanlike, prohibited, or illegal conduct. Verbal or physical aggression towards the public, local officials, fellow participants, or Competition Officials, or acts of vandalism, theft, or harassment will not be tolerated, and may result in a time penalty and / or disqualification from the Competition, at the sole discretion of the Competition Officials.

3. Team Shadow:

A specific Competition Official (a "Shadow") may be assigned to each team at various points throughout the Competition. This Shadow will be the team's judge. He or she has the authority to report and/or disqualify a team who breaches these Official Rules in any way at any time, as determined in his or her sole discretion. Team Shadows or other on-site Competition Official(s) will determine, in their sole and absolute discretion, whether or not a team has successfully completed a challenge. Decisions of the Shadow, and/or the Competition Officials, are final and binding in all matters related to this Competition. Teams may not ask for, nor accept, assistance of any kind from any Shadow or Competition Official.

4. Time Penalties, Credits and Disqualification:

The Competition Officials reserve the right to impose time penalties or to disqualify for any reason at any time, at their absolute sole discretion, any team or team member engaging in, or thought to be engaging in, any conduct that is contrary to these Official Rules or the instructions of Competition Officials. Without limiting the generality of the foregoing, Competition Officials reserve the right to disqualify any team member or team that appears to the Competition Officials (i) not to be making a genuine effort to compete, (ii) not to be conducting themselves in a safe and sportsmanlike manner, (iii) to be taking an unusually long period of time (or longer than the rest of the competitors) to complete a particular

challenge or the Competition as a whole, or (iv) not to have satisfactorily completed a given challenge. In the event that a single team member is disqualified, his or her team shall be disqualified and forfeit the right to participate further in the Competition or to win a prize.

If more than one team is present at a challenge location at the same time, the teams will complete the challenge in the order in which they arrived. Competition Officials reserve the right to delay a team until the previous team has completed the challenge before allowing the second team to begin, with or without a time credit at the discretion of the Competition Official.

In the event of physical injury, sickness, accident or any other incident which may bring into question an individual's ability to safely complete the Competition, a Shadow or other Competition Official, in its absolute and sole discretion, may delay or disqualify the team. For greater certainty, the Competition Officials reserve the right to disqualify a team, or to cancel, suspend, amend or terminate the Competition at any time, at their sole and absolute discretion, if any factor interferes with the ability of the participants to safely complete the Competition as contemplated by these Official Rules.

5. **Prizes:** Competition is open to all participants of The 2008 World City Chase Championships. Competition is subject to all applicable Federal, Provincial and Municipal laws.

Grand Prize:

One (1) Grand Prize will be awarded to the winning team, consisting of:

- a) The winners (team of two) of the 2008 City Chase World Championships will be invited to Right To Play project locations in one of more than 20 countries of operation across Africa, Asia and the Middle East. While efforts will be made to accommodate winners' schedules, Right To Play reserves the right to select the country location and visit timing. Visit will be three to four days and will be held before April 30th, 2009. Further details to be announced after winners are determined.

- b) If a winner does not comply with the competition requirements, or the official Event Rules, the Competition Sponsors and/or Event Organizers will have the right to select a new winner (whereupon the initial winner will be deemed to have forfeited any rights to the Prize) and award Prize to such a team in the manner provided above. The decisions of the competition judges will be final and binding on all entrants.
- c) No cash alternative will be offered. The prize must be accepted as awarded and is not transferable.
- d) The winner agrees to sign a release form releasing the Competition Sponsors from any and all liability, confirming compliance with competition rules and accepting prize as awarded in order to obtain the prize.
- e) The winner further agrees to permit the Competition Sponsors to use the winner's name, address and photograph and/or video image in any publicity or advertising without compensation, and releasing the Competition Sponsors and their respective agents, officers, directors, employees and representatives from any and all liability, damages, costs, expenses and claims arising out of or relating to the Prize.

6. Interruptions for Filming and Event Planning/Execution:

It is expressly understood that the Competition is being filmed for television and promotional purposes. In an effort to accommodate the execution/planning/filming of the Competition, it may be necessary for the Competition Officials to (i) augment these Official Rules with verbal or written instructions during the Competition, (ii) adjust team time credits/penalties in light of delays caused by filming/planning/execution requests, reshoots, technical issues and the like, (iii) delay the start of, or interrupt and restart, any given challenge, or (iv) otherwise amend or intervene in the operation of the Competition. The Competition Officials shall, in their sole and absolute discretion, make every reasonable effort to ensure that, if there is any positive or negative impact to a team's performance caused by such amendments or interventions, such impact will be equally balanced among all teams.

7. Additional Terms and Conditions:

By participating in this Competition, participants agree to abide by these Official Rules. Entrants who have not complied with these Official Rules are subject to disqualification. City Chase Inc. reserves the right to disqualify any entrant whose character or conduct, if declared to be the winner, could bring the reputation of the Competition, its sponsors or City Chase Inc. into disrepute. City Chase Inc. reserves the right to modify the Official Rules in any way at any time it deems necessary or appropriate without materially affecting the terms and conditions of this Competition. Contestants and the winning team agree to make themselves available, without further compensation, to participate in additional publicity appearances as may be reasonably requested by City Chase Inc. Contestants shall not, without City Chase Inc.'s prior written consent, give any interview or make, give or release any statement for publication, or otherwise to be made public, by any means relating to the Competition. The Competition is subject to all applicable laws of the province of Ontario and the laws of Canada applicable therein. The courts of Toronto shall be the exclusive jurisdiction to hear any matter arising out of the Competition. All rules and event instructions have been written in the vernacular of Canadian English and should be interpreted as such. In the event of any discrepancy or inconsistency between the English language version and any other version of the Official Rules and any other Competition documents, translations of which may be provided at the sole discretion of the City Chase Inc. for convenience only, the English version shall prevail, govern and control.
